group responsible for introducing African safaris to Asia—this year, A2A lists Latin America and Antarctica in their travel arsenal. Close to 200 years since Charles Darwin went into detail about natural selection, the Galapagos Islands seem to be *the* place to be, and exploring it via small liners is just the way to do it. An A2A favorite for exploring the wildlife of the islands is the *MY Grace*, named after its original owner,

Her Serene Highness, Princess Grace of Monaco. The ship was originally a gift from Aristotle Onassis to Princess Grace and Prince Rainier of Monaco, who spent their honeymoon onboard in the 1950s. The Grace is outfitted with two master suites, two twin suites, and five premium staterooms, which can accommodate up to 18 passengers. There's also a jacuzzi on the deck, and glass bottom kayaks for guests to use (which have penguins swimming under them on most days). The great thing about such a small cruise is the intimacy it brings when touring the islands, making it a very personal and private way to travel. A Naturalist Guide, with diverse knowledge of wildlife both on land and underwater, is assigned to manage the seven-day tour. The weeklong cruise begins at Whaler Bay, where a number of seabirds and marine iguanas are located. Within the week, travelers get the chance to see the Galapagos White-tipped Shark and Tower Island at Darwin Bay, as well as snorkel through the waters of the Humboldt Current. Of A2A's new travel offerings, Wetherell insists Ecuador and the Galapagos (by way of the Grace) is the ultimate way to go. "The country has so much to offer—incredible culture, adventure, beautiful cities, Amazon jungle, and of course the highlight—the Galapagos Islands. It's definitely somewhere where everyone will find something that they enjoy, whatever their interests."

Cross Continental

Following the success of their African safaris, A2A introduces bespoke journeys through Latin America and Antarctica. Travel specialist Steph Wetherell brings us up to speed



Which regions are your areas of expertise?

We are specialists and have deep expertise in six destinations within Latin America: Mexico, Peru, Argentina, Chile, Brazil, and Ecuador and the Galapagos Islands, as well as Antarctica. They are all great destinations, but if I had to pick one to highlight, I would choose Ecuador and the Galapagos.

If there was just one thing you recommend, what would that activity be?

That is a hard one—there is so much diversity in Ecuador! The Galapagos Islands are spectacular though and a seven-night cruise aboard the *Grace* is an unforgettable experience. For Antarctica, I'd recommend you give yourself a little more time. This is the ultimate once in a lifetime experience, a completely uninhabited continent where you will see spectacular scenery all around as well as some amazing wildlife, including penguins, seals, Mike and Humpback Whales, and even Orcas.

Why did A2A take on Latin America?

Many of our clients in Asia have told us they wanted to continue to go to new exotic destinations with us, and that has very much encouraged us to diversify. Much like Africa, we feel that Latin America is a destination which requires specialist and expert knowledge to ensure the highest quality journey and experience. Access to the famous ruins at Chichen Itza, Mexico before they were open to the public, private candlelit dinners at the foot of a Mayan temple, surprise picnics set up by the guides in Torres del Paine National Park in Chile, meeting one of the surviving members of the original Buena Vista Social Club in Cuba. But it is often the small touches which make a place unforgettable to me—like a guide noticing I like Diet Coke and dutifully carrying one four hours up a mountain for me because he knew I would probably want one when we got to the top!
